

## **ENERGY INTERN (SUMMER 2013)**

**SALARY: \$5,000**

**CLOSING DATE: MAY 3, 2013**

As part of the 2013 Energy Summer Intern Program sponsored by the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners (NARUC), the Connecticut Public Utilities Regulator Authority (PURA or Authority) is seeking a graduate student interested in the energy sector for a full-time, 10-week internship. The selected intern will work at PURA's office, located in New Britain, Connecticut.

The intern will receive a stipend from NARUC while working for PURA in various areas of energy regulation. NARUC will provide a stipend of \$5,000 payable directly to the intern in two installments for a 10-week internship. NARUC requires that the intern prepare a short report at the end of the internship, detailing work activities and accomplishments.

The intern will have the opportunity to work on regulatory, technical, economic and policy matters with the Legal Division at PURA. The intern will be assigned to work on (a) drafting regulations and/or guidelines concerning the certification process of renewable energy sources that seek to qualify for Connecticut renewable energy certificates, and (b) developing procedures, standards and requirements for the voluntary renewable energy products market in Connecticut. The intern's tasks will include, but are not limited to: (1) research and gather information about renewable energy sources wholesalers or traders; (2) research into other states' standards and requirements applicable to voluntary green products; (3) analyze and compare the practices of renewable sources wholesalers with the New England Power Pool-GIS system; and (4) use the research and information gathered to develop standards and requirements to be imposed on entities that seek to provide voluntary green products in Connecticut. The intern will have the opportunity to witness or attend official PURA hearings and proceedings on issues before PURA. In addition, Connecticut is in the process of implementing its first Comprehensive Energy Strategy, and the intern will have the unique opportunity to learn firsthand the process of taking cutting edge energy policy and applying it to utility practices. There will be no clerical duties.

A bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university and a recent graduate or currently attending graduate school.
